

## Teens' Creative Project Helps Patients at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children

A group of students from Ursuline Academy of Dallas worked together this summer on a project they named "Socks for Tots," to help patients at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children who have undergone hand surgery.



Using paint, glitter, ribbon and lots of imagination, the students decorated 200 tube socks for TSRHC patients recovering from hand surgery. The socks can be used as a protective cover to keep a cast clean and a safe alternative to a sling for children less than 5 years of age.

The girls, members of Ursuline Academy's class of 2012, chose to decorate the socks as a heartfelt and personalized way of giving back to the community.
