Externs get the chance to attend educational seminars, in-services and join patients at one of the hospital's specialized summer camps.

Ambulatory Care

Ambulatory Care (AC) clinics are the first point of contact with Scottish Rite for Children patients. Each physician has a nurse coordinator that will serve as a preceptor for the nurse externs.

An important part of the nurse assessment is to ensure that the patient and their family understand the patient's individualized treatment plan. In addition, the nurse will provide educational materials to the family specific to their child's procedure. This will support the family in following the patient's treatment plan properly.

The nurse extern will:

- Coordinate with other disciplines involved in upcoming surgeries, procedures, treatment and/or therapies.
- Follow up with patient families after clinic visits to address questions and/or concerns as deemed appropriate.
- Assist with off-site referrals and coordinate evaluations by other physicians when necessary.

Ambulatory Care hours:

Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Inpatient Unit

The inpatient unit is a 52-bed unit that operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The inpatient nurse's primary role is to provide nursing care to medical and surgical patients with orthopedic, neurodevelopmental and musculoskeletal conditions. The nurses work three, 12-hour shifts per week including weekends. The extern will pair up with a nurse preceptor working the same schedule and will perform various skills and procedures under supervision.

The nurse extern will:

- Learn to effectively communicate with staff and patients and families according to their developmental levels, and reinforce patient education.
- Participate in clinical rounds with physicians and other disciplinary teams, such as O.T., P.T., Psychology, Therapeutic Recreation and Child Life.
- Assist with the admission process.
- Support the monitoring of patient vital signs, fluid intake and output; in addition to wound care, cast care and dressing change.
- Assist with screening and management of pain using non-pharmacological interventions.
- Help patients requiring Halo, Bucks or Skeletal traction; provide care and assessments for patients with a Halo/Ilizarov traction/external device.
- Perform intermittent catheterization and support ng-tube and g-tube feeding and care.

Inpatient Unit hours:

Sunday through Saturday, three 12-hour shifts (days/nights)

Neurological & Pediatric Developmental Disabilities Care

With an ultimate goal of developing a positive, competent behavior that enhances one's professional growth and development, the nurse extern will be responsible for providing the patient and family with a sense of security and satisfaction with their clinical care.

The nurse extern will:

- Perform a comprehensive patient/family assessment.
- Develop and implement a care plan for patients, as well as groups of patients and families.
- Provide family-centered, developmentally appropriate nursing care.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of the nursing care provided.
 - Work with a wide variety of unusual Neurological diagnoses.
 - Attend a specialized summer camp, as desired.
 - Observe various methodologies of treatments and procedures including: EEG, EMG, NCV, Botox, serial casting, lumbar punctures, and casting.
- Developmental Disabilities

<u>Neurology</u>

- Work with the Spina Bifida population, as well as other chronically ill children in this department.
- Attend Spina Bifida camp and assist with care.
- Participate in Neurosurgery and Urology Clinics with these patients.

Surgical Services

A nurse extern will have a unique opportunity to learn what the perioperative nursing role encompasses. A total team approach is taken at Scottish Rite for Children. An experienced nurse preceptor will help teach patient care and safety, and encourage participation in care provided by the OR staff in a perioperative setting. These participation opportunities include:

- Pre-Operative: Day Surgery and Holding Area
- Intra-Operative: Anesthesia, Circulating Nurse and Scrub
- Post-Operative: Post-Anesthesia Care Unit and Day Surgery

In addition, a surgical services extern will participate in hands-on patient care such as:

- Peripheral IV access
- Aseptic technique
- Urinary catheterization
- Assessments
- Patient and family education
- Airway management

Sports Medicine

The Sports Medicine team cares for pediatric patients on an outpatient care basis. They focus on sports-related musculoskeletal injuries and conditions in skeletally immature athletes. The team specializes in conditions and injuries that affect the shoulder, elbow, ankle, knee and hip, along with stress fracture and sports-related concussion management. A nurse will precept the extern and focus on clinical skills as he/she rotates through the various clinics at the Frisco facility.

The nurse extern will:

- Work with sports medicine physicians, athletic trainers and physical therapists.
- Coordinate with other disciplines involved in upcoming surgeries, procedures, treatment and/or therapies.
- Follow up with patient families after clinic visits to address questions and/or concerns. as deemed appropriate.
